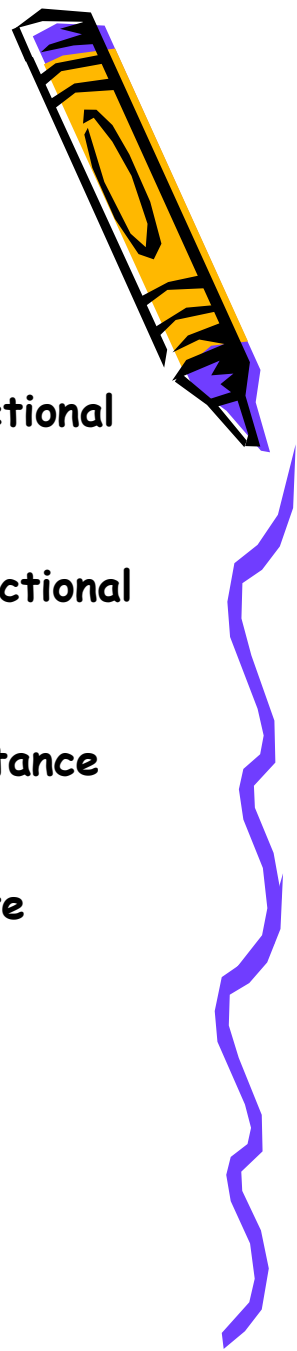

The late bus leaves at 4:15." All students need a current bus pass from the transportation department, along with the late bus sticker, in order to be able to ride the late bus.

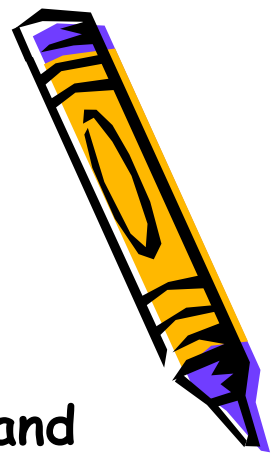


Read 180

READ 180 is an intensive reading intervention program that helps educators confront the problem of adolescent illiteracy and special needs reading on multiple fronts, using technology, print, and professional development. *READ 180* is proven to meet the needs of struggling readers whose reading achievement is below proficient level. The program directly addresses individual needs through differentiated instruction, adaptive and instructional software, high-interest literature, and direct instruction in reading, writing, and vocabulary skills.



Computer Lab



A computer lab provides computer assisted instruction and software program support such as STAR Reading in a PC computer lab.

Parents are welcome to use our computers in the Career Center during the school day until 2:30. Parents are also welcome to use our computers after school from 2:30 - 3:15 in the Room 236 Computer Lab.







Staff Support

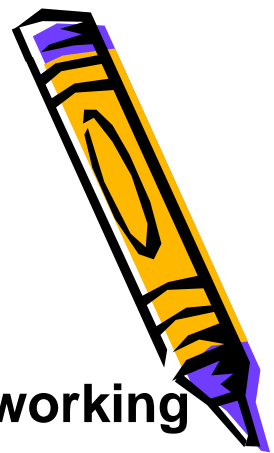
LHS offers several staff members that support our Title 1 program including a Title 1 Counselor and a Title 1 Administrator.

The mission of AVID is to ensure that ALL students, and most especially the least served students who are in the middle:

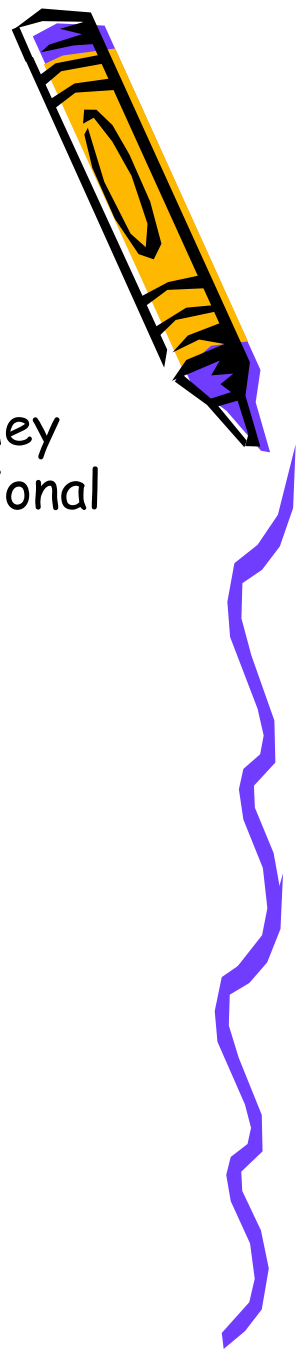
-  will succeed in rigorous curriculum;
